## Treasurer Names Marc Lifsher as New Communications Director Lifsher Was a Journalist for More Than Four Decades

Lifsher served as Andean correspondent for the Wall Street Journal in Venezuela, where he covered politics, economics, energy, and other issues in Venezuela, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Bolivia. He reported on the 2002 economic crisis in Argentina and the rise of Venezuelan strongman President Hugo Chavez. Lifsher was also a reporter for the Wall Street Journal Sacramento bureau, where he covered agriculture, environmental, natural resources, regulatory and other business-related issues for a weekly California regional edition.

Prior to the Wall Street Journal, Lifsher was a capital correspondent for the Orange County Register in Sacramento. He covered politics and government at the paper's state capital bureau.

Lifsher won major awards for stories on the use of lethal force in state prisons, and he was part of a team that won the Pulitzer Prize for stories about a fertility program at University of California, Irvine. He has a master of arts in journalism from the University of Oregon, bachelor of arts degree in international affairs from Elliott School of International Affairs at George Washington University, and studied history, economics, and political science from the City London College in London.
